
Staffordshire figurines, to a pair of Empire-style armchairs given to Osborn by Gianni Versace.

Osborn told us then he was considering a move, but his vast collection had proved problematic: "Two different movers have come in to give me estimates, and both flatly declined the job."

Seems third time was the charm. A portion of Osborn's herd is now on view in DAG's preview room, and the entire collection will be online for two weeks before the Oct. 14 sale.
