n 1804, William Jefferds, Jr., a prosperous merchant L sea captain, built his dream home in the heart of historic Kennebunkport. Graced by a distinctive fanight window above its ntrance, the spacious Fedral-style abode stood as yet another ornament to this beautiful seaside village. Today, the house offers bed and breakfast to travelers Down East, especially those with an eye for antiques. "Staying here is just like visiting old friends," says one regular visitor.
